To purchase a FirstNet Responder plan as a Subscriber Paid User, you must be (a) a verified current employee/volunteer for a qualified public safety entity who serves in law enforcement, fire protection, emergency medical services (including emergency departments), emergency 911 call dispatch, National Guard or emergency management; or (b) employees of eligible entities that contribute to, or help enable, or support the provision of public safety services to first responders and whose duties are directly related to contributing, enabling or providing public safety services. Your eligibility will be verified by your qualified public safety entity or through a process begun in an AT&T retail location or firstnet.com/signup. You will be subject to periodic re-verification. You must have an AT&T Wireless Customer Agreement and an individual FirstNet account. You will be limited to 4 FirstNet Responder lines of service — 1 each of phone, tablet, wearable and connected data device. **If you are not a verified Subscriber Paid User or are in violation of the single line limit for each device, AT&T may suspend, change or terminate your FirstNet service.
